



Szalajka Valley

The **Veil-Waterfall** (on the cover) is one of the most beautiful and prominent natural formations in Hungary. Seventeen meter long unique natural beauty, where water flows in a form of a veil through eighteen sinter terraces.

The **Rock Spring** is a valuable sight of the Bükk-mountains. The water that gush forth here, is the main feeder of the **Szalajka Creek**. It doesn't freeze in winter, it evaporates typically.



Millennium View Tower

The siberian larch tower dominates the surrounding mountain peaks. From the terrace of 20 meters above has a stunning look in different colours in every season at the **Bükk Mountains**.

It also can be approached on the **Millennium Trail** on foot.



Szilvásvár

State Forest Railway

From the station at the entrance to the **Szalajka Valley** the small train starts on the steepest narrow gauge railway in Hungary and arrives at its final destination, **Gloriett Clearing** after a 15-minute trip.



Lipizzaner horses

Since 1950's these stunning horses has been breeding in Szilvásvár. You can marvel at the youngest foals with the mares at the **Stud yard** or in the pastures, the studs separately in Szilvásvár and the yearlings at **Csipkésút** on the **Bükk Highland**.



The Lipizzaners achieve outstanding results primarily in carriage driving competitions worldwide.



Trout ponds Brown trout

The springs provide water with the appropriate temperature for trout breeding. Next to the road we can find several ponds with native species: the brown and the rainbow trout.

Calvinist Round Church

This unique white building was built between 1837 and 1841, in folk-classicist style with the financial support of Count Miklós Keglevich.

This is the largest **Calvinist Round Church** in Europe and the only one in Hungary.

One of the oldest bells in the country can be heard from a separate bell tower every day.



Prehistoric man's cave

Approx. 40.000 years old fossils were found in the cave at **Istállóskő**: three skulls of cave bear, the second oldest flute in the world, a broken bone marrow, and numerous stone and bone tools.
